A NOTE FROM OUR EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

Covid-19 descended upon our communities in March 2020. We were optimistic that it would be over by the end of the year. It is still present in 2021. Yet, we continued to work under challenging conditions: masking, using sanitizers, social distancing, scheduling vaccinations, and contemplating the unknown. When will this all be over?

Before 2020, the poverty in our community was well documented. As a Center, we have always strived to address the issues of generational poverty, seeking ways to break the cycle. The existing conditions were exacerbated

when we maintained the virtual tutoring program even as students returned to school. In addition, we distributed laptops, computers, and hot spots to youth and their families. Our staff was keenly aware of the learning loss suffered by young people living in our community. We must continue to offer the academic support necessary to help our students recover the knowledge lost over the past two years.

Additionally, the mental health of our staff and program participants is a significant concern. Our

With funding from the public and private sector, All Peoples provided financial support; rental and utility assistance, cash cards, grocery cards, diapers, hygiene kits, food, fresh produce, baby formula, etc.







In the All Peoples Service Area (primarily zip code 90011), the majority of residents (89.9%) identify as Latino (primarily Mexican), with Black being the next largest group at 8.3%. True to the neighborhood demographics, All Peoples is open to all residents and primarily serves low-income Latino families. According to internal data, 84% of individuals served by All Peoples are Latino, and 100% are low-income.

All Peoples provides a coordinated effort - all under one roof - to increase the financial stability of families, assist in youth academic achievement, and promote healthy lifestyles through sports & exercise, along with a nutritious diet through our community garden.




ALL PEOPLES HAS BEEN GROWING AND EXPANDING AT A RAPID PACE






PROGRAM HIGHLIGHTS





COLLEGE CORNER


Our College Advisors work closely with all youth, elementary to high school, to ensure that everyone knows that “College is Possible” regardless of socioeconomic status. College Advisors conduct workshops and one-on-one sessions with high school youth to review transcripts, college admissions, academic requirements, and scholarship opportunities that align with the youth’s goals and aspirations. During these sessions, College Advisors and youth conduct career options, salary, and college research based on the youth’s likes and interests and develop and implement a college plan and possible career path.

College Advisors assist with mandated college or youth employment program testing, including CASAS, SAT, and ACT. College Advisors also assist with financial aid and college application forms and schedule college tours for youth and parents to attend.



COLLEGE CORNER: PARENTS WORKSHOP

In collaboration with Coalition for Responsible Community Development and the Los Angeles Unified School District's on-site Pupil Service and Attendance Counselor, we provided a 5-week Parent-Student College Workshop series entitled "Habits of Successful Families" so that youth and parents can share a common goal and understand the required steps for the college path.



GERALDINE MORGAN SCHOLARSHIP FUND

All Peoples established The Geraldine Morgan Scholarship Fund to provide financial support to low-income South Los Angeles students who aspire to enroll in a 2-or-4-year higher education institution. Youth who are enrolled in our After-School “Tomorrow’s Leaders” Program, FamilySource College Corner, and our YouthSource Center are eligible to apply to the scholarship fund. All of our recipients are first-generation college students.

Through donor support, All Peoples offers our Geraldine Morgan Scholarship Fund. We award a minimum of four - \$1,000 scholarships every year. The number of scholarships distributed annually is based on funding received by foundations and individual donor support. It is a competitive process, and applicants are only eligible to receive the scholarship once. A panel of 3-4 judges selects each year’s scholarship recipients based on criteria including a 250-500 word essay submission, a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher, and civic engagement.






READING AND MATH TUTORING PROGRAM

For youth needing additional academic support, All Peoples offers a Reading and Math Virtual Tutoring program, which serves an average of 65 youth per semester. Sessions are twice a week for 45 minutes. Additional sessions are available for students needing additional academic support. A small number of youth receive in-person services due to the COVID-19 mandate.



“URBAN ADVENTURES” SUMMER DAY CAMP

To help prevent summer learning loss, All Peoples offers a Summer Day Camp program. Summer Day Camp was for 60 youth entering 2nd-8th grade (ages 6-14) from June 21, 2021 - July 29, 2021. The goal is for campers to sustain or increase their reading and math levels over the summer, which assists youth to 1) advance to the next grade level from elementary to middle to high school graduation; and 2) strengthen academic preparation and readiness for college and career.

In addition to academic support, All Peoples offered 18 Junior Camp Counselor positions for youth 14 to 24 years of age - allowing youth to develop leadership skills and be role models through their attitude and behavior.

This year we received a grant from “Great Public Schools Now.” It is because of their generosity that Summer Day Camp “Urban Adventures 2021” was free for all participants.

YOUTHSOURCE COHORT INTERNS

A critical component of developing “Tomorrow’s Leaders” is establishing the habit of civic engagement at an early age. Our YouthSource high school seniors participated in a 6-month civic engagement Youth-Source Cohort Program. Seniors were paired with elementary and middle school students and served as mentors, providing weekly educational workshops. Through virtual presentations, Seniors showed the younger youth how to be better students, what to expect in the upcoming school year, and how to navigate the educational system.




SUMMER YOUTH EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM

APCC offers a city-funded paid work experience program called Summer Youth Employment Program (SYEP), which employs an average of 115 youth annually through two SYEP cycles, investing \$207,000 of income back into our communities.

VITA – FREE TAX PREPARATION

All Peoples offered free VITA tax services for 2021 tax season. Tax services were provided from February 2021 to May 2021. All Peoples VITA volunteers, staff, and partners Mexican American Opportunity Foundation (MAOF) and Cal State L.A. students obtained refunds totaling \$701,827 in preparation of 393 Federal and State Tax Returns!

All Peoples hosted our Annual Community Thanksgiving Dinner as a "GRAB N' GO" event for our South Los Angeles Community. We distributed turkeys and Thanksgiving baskets to 348 families.

We're grateful to individuals and group volunteers who helped distribute food to the community, including Jan Perry Shelter Partnership staff, LA Host Lions Club, and Pacific Southwest Disciples of Christ Regional staff. Thank you also to Diane Kenney for the donation of stuffing and Todd Doram with Kings Harbor Fellowship, that also donated 50 bags of "fixings." The event was sponsored by Disciples Home Missions' "Remember There Are No Undeserving Children in the World."

In addition, All Peoples, in partnership with United Way of Greater Los Angeles, adopted 11 families for Thanksgiving. Each family received a Turkey basket. Our partner Best Start Region 1, distributed Holiday baskets to an additional 38 families.

Our Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) volunteers enjoyed the 21st Annual Senior Appreciation Luncheon celebration from the comfort of their homes. District 9 residents 65 and over received one free lunch and care package delivered to their doorstep. The event is sponsored by Councilman Curren Price - Council District 9.





In addition to our standard programs and services, All Peoples continued to offer the following COVID-19 Recovery Programs and Emergency Services throughout 2021:

- Supplemental Food Program
- Senior Food Delivery Service
- The Homeless Prevention Program (HPP) and Eviction Defense Fund (EDP)
- CSBG CARES
- Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP)
- Burial Assistance Program
- Vaccination Clinic/Education

RENTAL ASSISTANCE

Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP) assisted clients with rental arrears due to the COVID -19 program. The City of Los Angeles paid the Landlord up to 80% of the arrears if the balance is forgiven. Five All Peoples staff were hired or assigned to implement this program.

The Homeless Prevention Program (HPP) aims to prevent homelessness for individuals. We provided rental, utility, transportation, rental deposit, and furnishings. HPP has provided \$116,236 in assistance to 70 clients since July 2020.

SENIOR FOOD DELIVERY PROGRAM



Before COVID-19, our food distribution program was popular with older adults in South Los Angeles. However, our staff has observed that seniors stopped picking up food since the Safer-at-Home order began in March 2020. We understand this shift is due to their age and vulnerability to COVID-19. “The people living in communities hardest hit by the coronavirus tend to be low-income, elderly, and those with underlying health issues,” Health News, April 2020. In addition, many of those seniors are living alone and unable to depend on friends or family to pick up food.

In response, we created the Senior Food Delivery Service in October 2020 to (1) supplement the food supply for older adults, (2) promote healthy eating habits, and (3) connect people to needed services and information. All Peoples staff members deliver supplemental food supplies directly to the homes of older adults 55+ in a manner that complies with public health guidelines. All Peoples successfully procured a relationship with CARE, allowing us to extend our Senior Food Delivery Program by providing DoorDash drivers for additional food deliveries. All Peoples successfully provided 185 seniors 55+ impacted by COVID -19 with groceries bi-weekly through our Senior Food Delivery Program.

In addition, through our regular Supplemental Food Program, All Peoples successfully provided 2,000 residents impacted by COVID -19 with access to weekly distributions of food boxes and essential products.

MOBILE VACCINATION CLINIC




All Peoples has served as a mobile vaccination site in partnership with St. Johns Well Child Center. Vaccines were also administered by the L.A. County Health Department, providing 97 vaccinations to the community. All Peoples, in partnership with the L.A. County Health Department, also conducted COVID-19 Vaccine Outreach campaigns through our social media platforms. In addition to the social media platforms, staff and volunteers made phone calls to more than 750 persons to inform them of the upcoming vaccination events. All Peoples staff collaborated with the staff of Councilman Curren Price, 9th District, to arrange vaccinations and transportation, if necessary, for more than 50 senior citizens.

ANGELENO CARD

All Peoples FamilySource Staff assisted with distributing the city-funded Angeleno Cards (\$700-\$1,500 based on family size). A total of over \$2 MILLION was provided to residents, serving 2,231 families.

South Los Angeles has one of the highest COVID-19 infection rates countywide. In our service area, there were 10,980 reported cases of COVID-19 in a population of 51,998 (How Race, Class, and Place fuel a Pandemic, 05-06-2020, updated 03-29-2021, [racecounts.org/COVID](https://www.racecounts.org/COVID)). 77% of individuals in our service area have lost at least half of their income due to COVID-19. Food insecurity in our community has increased from 57% to 76% (Best Start Metro LA Region 1 Report, December 13, 2020: California EDD).

27TH STREET RECOVERY

**THERE WAS A TRAGIC FIREWORKS EXPLOSION
ON JUNE 30, 2021 IN OUR COMMUNITY**

Our community was rocked on June 30, 2021, by the tragic fireworks explosion on 27th street. All Peoples is located on 20th Street, only 7 blocks from where the explosion occurred. We responded immediately by deploying staff to the Local Assistance Center at Trinity Recreation Center from July 7 – July 30, 2021. During that time, we saw more than 71 individuals. We took packaged food, diapers, and hygiene products and distributed those to persons in need. In addition, we provided grocery gift cards to 14 families.



On September 1, 2021, All Peoples joined alongside a cross-section of City and Community leaders standing in solidarity in support of a motion introduced by Councilmember Curren Price asking for an additional \$5 MILLION to help the impacted District 9 community recover from the devastating fireworks explosion. The proposal outlined a “27th Street Recovery Plan” to aid residents’ long term while providing additional infrastructure improvements, mental health services, jobs, workforce development, access to children’s services, business grants, and priority consideration in the Guaranteed Basic Income program.



On behalf of All Peoples, our very own Daniela Navarro spoke out in solidarity of the Councilman's recovery efforts along with other partner organizations such as Coalition for Responsible Community Development, South Central Neighborhood Council, SAJE, Kedren Health, St. John's Well Child and Family Center, City of Los Angeles Emergency Management Department and the Community Investment for Families Department (CIFD).

Daniela Navarro continues to provide case management to the displaced families living in the Hotel paid for by the City of Los Angeles. She is assisting with food, housing, mental health and legal

referrals, other services and coordination with various City Departments including Emergency Management Services of the City of Los Angeles. She has served more than 81 individuals affected and or displaced by the explosion.

Our team meets with the Councilman's staff, City of Los Angeles Emergency Management Team, CIFD, various City Departments, and L.A. County Department of Mental Health at least three times a week to address the needs of families in the Hotel and the community impacted by this tragic situation.



Mr. Brown, pictured to the left, represents one of the families impacted by the explosion. He needed Enfamil Baby formula for two infants, and All Peoples was able to provide him with several cans.

In October 2021, the Newton Police Department introduced Rocket Rules to the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd graders in our After-School "Tomorrow's Leaders" Program. Participants also included families from the 27th Street Explosion. Rocket Rules' mission is to educate and inspire kids and their families to be prepared for emergencies, saving lives! Honoring the work of first responders, the Rocket Rules program taught our youth emergency preparedness, safety awareness, and social emotional skills in the event of an emergency.



HEALTH EDUCATION

All Peoples continues its mission of offering residents health education and referral services. All Peoples was awarded a 2020 Title X Family Planning Services Program grant, impacting over 200 women and 75 youth with health and wellness through family planning education and services. All Peoples provided a 4-series sexual and reproductive health care education workshop at surrounding schools and community centers through the Faith + Community-Based Education and Outreach (FCBEO) partnership with Essential Access Health and the South Central Health Clinic.



DOORDASH

All Peoples successfully procured a relationship with CARE, allowing us to extend our Senior Food Delivery Program by providing DoorDash drivers for additional food deliveries. We have expanded our Senior Food Delivery Program through our relationship with DoorDash. Food deliveries are made three times a week. Deliveries are scheduled from Wednesday - Friday from 9:00 am to 2:00 pm, with each participant receiving food twice a month. All Peoples successfully provided 185 seniors 55+ impacted by COVID -19 with groceries bi-weekly.

Upon completion of the safety workshops, community members gathered and conducted safety walks throughout the South Los Angeles Community. The City of Los Angeles Community Investment for Families Department (CIFD) administers the program through the FamilySource Centers.

While facing some of the most unprecedented challenges of the Center's history, your support allowed us to serve our South Los Angeles community without skipping a beat. We can't provide these essential services without you, and we are grateful for your commitment to All Peoples!

In its 79th year of service, All Peoples Community Center showed how effectively it could adapt to address the community's needs. The ongoing crisis of the COVID-19 pandemic brought continued risks to our already disadvantaged area, and All Peoples responded. As an essential services provider for the City of Los Angeles, All Peoples kept its doors open to distribute city-funded Angelino Cards, and provide hunger relief for families and seniors, emergency rental relief, bereavement assistance, homeless prevention and prevention of learning loss for school-age students. With the leadership of our talented Executive Team, the hard-working staff of All Peoples remained dedicated to providing the best possible support for the community by responding with necessary services.

Adept at assisting with our clients' needs, All Peoples also pivoted to respond to a local emergency that occurred within our community. On the evening of June 30, 2021, South Los Angeles experienced a major explosion, when illegal fireworks and explosives were detonated as part of a seizure by the Los Angeles Police Department. The blast damaged 35 homes, injured 17 people, and displaced many neighbors – several of whom still haven't been able to return. All Peoples stepped up to provide case management and manage communication between clients and the various city departments involved. Without this continued assistance and coordination from All Peoples, our neighbors would be even more severely affected by this devastating event.

The All Peoples Board of Directors also found new ways to adapt to our current environment. In an effort to be more inclusive and reflective of the com-

munity we serve, one of the Board's top goals was to actively pursue more diversity within our membership. We have been recruiting membership from within the community and from local organizations which have an understanding of the issues our clients face. This purposeful adjustment helped our Board develop a stronger perspective of the role that All Peoples Community Center continues to play as a leading service provider in the City of Los Angeles.

The Board also put an emphasis on its own professional development. In Spring 2021, the National Benevolent Association sponsored the White Co-Conspirators Conference to help white people better understand how they can be more active in becoming anti-racist. Four of our Board members attended in support of our goals of inclusion and equity, and to further our own education and growth. Additionally, adjusting to the safety measures enacted by the COVID-19 pandemic meant that our Board transitioned to virtual meetings. For the first time since March 2020, the Board of Directors finally had an opportunity to meet in-person at the Center to hold a retreat in July 2021. What a gift it was to spend time together after being separated for so long! We spent our day building connections as a team, clarifying our roles and responsibilities, celebrating our progress, and solidifying the goals and priorities for All Peoples. The time spent together was a much-needed change and provided valuable insight to allow us to continue making forward progress as a unified group.

Thank you all for maintaining your relationship with this special organization which has become a second home to so many throughout its history. We are greatly appreciative of the time and donations that you have given, all of which allow us to continue providing vital services to South Los Angeles. As we look ahead to our 80th year of service to this city, we remain humbled by the difference we have been able to make with your support.
